Ash Wednesday worship services will be held on February 26. Services will be at 1:00 & 6:30 PM.




End 68 Hours of Hunger

Our team is responsible for packing food bags for children on 6 more Thursdays this school year. We pack at the First United Methodist Church, 129 Miller Ave. Portsmouth and we meet at 6pm. Depending on the number of volunteers, the packing process takes between 40 minutes to an hour - but rarely a full hour.


BG Library Article
